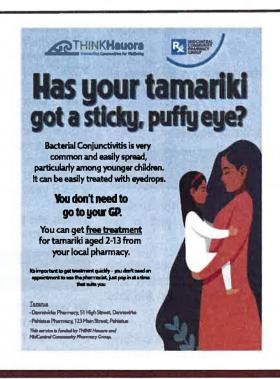

Has your tamariki got a sticky, puffy eye?
