Road Safety

"The Government's national road safety plan has identified the need for safer speed limits around all schools by the end of 2027. In response to this, Tararua District Council has developed a proposal to address these required changes within our district. This proposal is now open to community engagement and TDC would love to hear from you.

It's crucial for Council to hear your thoughts and opinions on these proposed changes. As the local governing body, Tararua District Council is responsible for overseeing all roads in our district, excluding state highways. Therefore, please note that these proposals do not include speed changes on state highways. Waka Kotahi/NZ Transport Agency, will handle those changes separately at a later date.

An information flyer detailing the changes to the proposed speeds around our school is attached. If you would like to make a comment on the proposal, please fill out the feedback form and return it to the office.

Your feedback will be taken into consideration by Council's elected members. They will carefully review your input and make the final decision regarding these proposed changes. Once a decision has been reached, the interim plan will be sent to Waka Kotahi/NZ Transport Agency for certification. TDC aims to implement the first phase of these changes by June 2024.

We encourage you to take this opportunity to make a difference in ensuring the safety of our school community and the wider district.






Huia Range School



Huia Range School is located on State Highway 2, where Waka Kotahi (formerly New Zealand Transport Agency) is the Road Controlling Authority. The proposed State Highway 30km/h VSL is shown on the map with the orange dotted line. This was consulted upon in December 2022 and is still undergoing assessment by Waka Kotahi, so what is shown here is indicative and is still to be confirmed by Waka Kotahi.

On the local roads, a segment of permanent 30 km/h speed limit is suggested for Cole Street, strategically encompassing the main pedestrian entrance to the school, the zebra crossing, and the area where children are picked up. This specific zone aims to enhance safety in critical school zones with high pedestrian activity. However, the speed reduction does not extend further on Cole Street and Thyra Street, as the road layout widens, and drivers may encounter challenges complying with slower speeds in these particular areas.
